1. Filled the attached entry form;
2. Return the entry form to 30th Anniversary Commemorative International Orienteering Competitions Organizer via fax or email;
3. Receipt of the entries will be acknowledged with a confirmation message and a demand note on the total entry fees to be paid. Please pay the entry fees according to the instructions in the confirmation message.
4. Once you paid the fee, please return the confirmation message and payment document (e.g. bank receipt) to 30th Anniversary Commemorative International Orienteering Competitions Organizer, and finish the entry procedures.

Terrain Description

Hilly area and steep slopes are characteristics of terrain found in Hong Kong. Most competition zones have good runnability and the dense scrubs (dark green) with extensive path or road network make it more challenging for orienteers.

Local Weather and Climate

Hong Kong's climate is sub-tropical, tending towards temperate for nearly half the year. During November and December there are pleasant breezes, plenty of sunshine and comfortable temperatures. Many people regards these as the best months of the year. Temperature in December ranges between 16-20 °C whilst it is not uncommon for temperature to drop below 10 °C in urban areas. 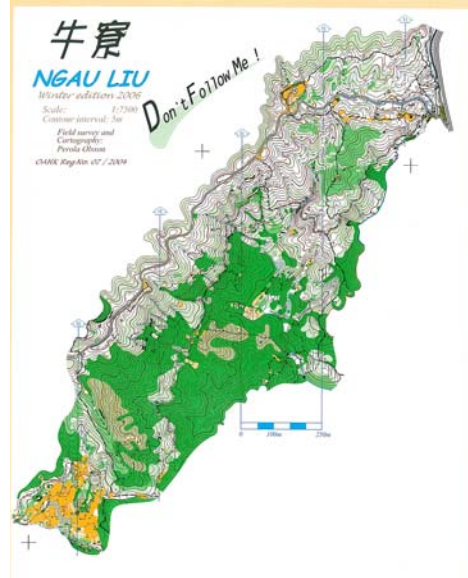

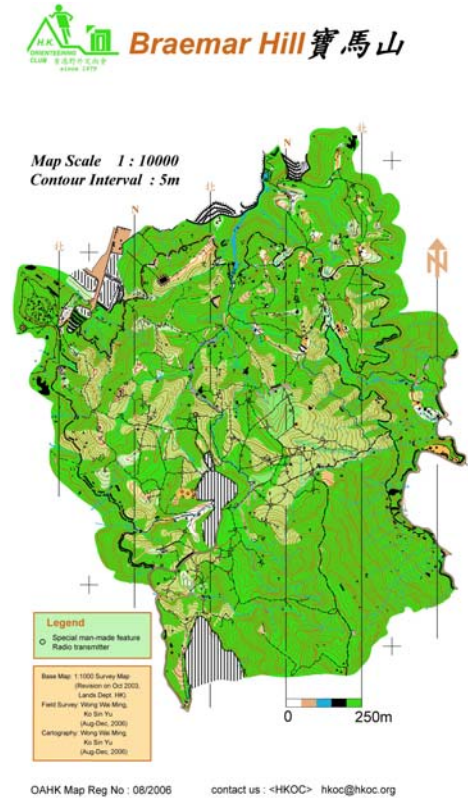
